



Creating Audio Using Soundbooth

To edit music using Soundbooth

Use the trim tool to trim the beginning or end of a clip. Simply click and drag.




To delete a selection, use the trim tool. Highlight the area you wish to delete and then press the delete key.



To record your voice in Soundbooth:

1. Choose File>Record, or simply click the red record button at the bottom of the screen.
2. Under the "Save" heading, enter a file name.
3. Change the location for the saved file to your HOME drive.
4. If you want to listen while recording, be sure to have headphones and select "Monitor Input During Recording."
5. Click the Record button to begin recording.
6. When you finish, press the Stop button.

*Soundbooth automatically records the new file as a WAV file. If you prefer a different format (like MP3), choose File>Save As.



To record your voice while listening to an audio track

1. Open your music in Windows Media Player.
2. Open Soundbooth. Put on your headphones and have your mic ready.
3. Select Record in Soundbooth and follow directions above, but don't start recording yet.
4. Play your music in Windows Media Player. Press record in Soundbooth and start recording. You should hear your music in your headphones but only your voice will record in Soundbooth.

To mix two audio tracks together (such as a music track and a voice track)

1. Open Soundbooth. Chose File>New Multitrack File.
2. Drag and drop your first track into Audio 1.
3. Drag and drop your second track into Audio 2.
4. If you need to add tracks, use the drop-down Tracks menu and Select "Add Audio Tracks."
5. Go to File>Save As. Choose a file type you need, such as MP3. Make sure to save to your HOME folder.
